Bites, scratches or illness caused by the dog	Staff, pupils and handlers	Medium	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Otis will remain vaccinated, wormed, and treated for fleas. • Otis is groomed regularly. • All staff and pupils are required to wash their hands after contact with dogs. • Handlers clear up dog urine and faeces promptly and dispose of this safely – pupils are told to stay away. • Dogs are not taken anywhere near food preparation areas. • Otis will be trained regularly by experienced handlers. • Children have been and will continue to be taught the impact of their actions through whole school assembly and PSHE lessons. • Children will be taught the importance of remaining calm around Otis. • Otis will receive ongoing formal training and socialising and conditioning within the school environment. • Children will be taught to stand and turn away from Otis if he attempts to jump up or mouth. • Otis will attend the vets regularly to ensure he is in good health. 	<p>J Foster</p> <p>Additional handlers</p>
